COVID-19 and education

- Most of us know COVID-19 by now
- People in 185 countries infected with over half a million deaths recorded
- Education is about equipping individuals to be useful members of society
- 1,184,126,508 learners affected (67.6% of total enrolled learners) and
 143 country-wide closures
- A shift to online learning represents a credible option



Education competencies, learning outcomes and teaching online

Competencies

- Knowledge
- Skills
- Behaviors

Learning outcomes

- SMART in nature
- May be more than one for a given competency

Teaching online

- A shift from onsite (Brick) to online (Click)
- Pre-arranged or live



Practical subjects

- Agriculture
- Information Technology and Computer Science
- Engineering
- Practical arts
- Physical education
- Etc





How do students learn?

- Active learning
- Student led learning
- Blended learning
- Work based learning
- Problem based learning





Teaching options online

- 1. Live or preset
- 2. Independent learning
- 3. Student collaboration

* Multimedia is crucial in teachning practical subjects online



Challenges of teaching practical subjects online

- 1. Low levels of digital skills
- 2. Cost of internet
- 3. Cost of online tools and production of learning materials
- 4. Differences in learning styles
- 5. Inaccessibility of certain learning materials in a home setting



Strategies for improving online teaching of practical subjects

- 1. Prepare well in advance of the online lesson (Modules are better)
- 2. Provide opportunities for asking questions
- 3. Relationship building is critical
- 4. Use various media creatively e.g live chats, websites, videos, pictures, audio, etc.
- 5. Use utilize social media channels and other platforms for group discussion
- 6. Encourage students to use tools such as VoiceThread, Youtube and others
- 7. Get proper training to teach online
